Three Handed

John KB0QKH frequents the Panera coffee shop near Wal-Mart in Council Bluffs and was there a couple of mornings ago using their **Free Wi-Fi** to check the position of satellites. Then, heading outside to the parking lot, he used a dual band three element hand held beam antenna on his **Yaesu VX-7** H/T, setting it for 145.85 up and 436.795 downlink on the main and sub-band VFOs, and started calling 'CQ' as the SO-50 satellite came over the horizon.

You're aware of course, that with low orbit satellites the doppler effect frequency shift has to be compensated for, 5 or 10kc as it's coming toward you and as much when receding. So it's understandable that after making a contact with AA4- something, aiming the beam, adjusting freq, and remembering to Push To Talk when transmitting, John forgot the rest of the guy's callsign. We're hoping he QSLs.

Extra Credit Q. High orbit (think GPS or synchronous) satellites are **more** / **less** affected by doppler. Choose one. Then explain why.

Late Note: A couple of weeks later (after the March newsletter was melded with April for this blockbuster issue) QKH used his mobile radio, 50 Watts, and omni antenna to contact K5OE in Texas on the way home from work. Actually, it's usual to put a range of freqs in 5 memories, and switch them in sequence to handle the doppler. Uh, you need to put in a 67 PL for this one also.

Meeting Minutes 02/23



George KD0NME bought an MFJ-1712S whip antenna for his H/T. Works. No longer noisy from his QTH into the .82 repeater. Extended it is 19 inches long. We adopted the Minutes as printed although we were looking at a single page out of the still to be printed newsletter. Our Treasurer reported \$4,372 in the bank.



Program Review

Ron NouCM brought in a couple of videos from Ten-Tec in Sevierville TN. First was all their manufacturing capabilities including cabinets. They make radios for the military. Then we saw a video demo of the Omni-7 HF transceiver.

McClelland Report

According to the sign-in sheet we had a hundred and twelve people pay the \$4 admission, and this year we sold all 26 tables in advance, and then a guy called who wanted to dispose of **Collins** brand radios from a relative's estate. Event Chairman Greg N0GR told him, OK, but you have to bring your own table. And he sold it allll-l. Asking \$1200 for the four Collins items, several guys commented, Boy, if I'd had the money I could have sold just 2 of them for double the price. The stuff had been stored for some time however. And the last place of rest had been the 'garbage' pile. To be tossed. (Some non Ham relatives unaware of the value.)

They included a **KWM-2** transceiver and **30L-1** power amp and 2 more pieces. Kenwoods included a 7950 2M rig marked \$70 bought by Ed KD0CVG for \$25 that looked like it had been in a pickup – real ratty. Ed had another 7950 that didn't work and swapped the good internals into his intact case. Other Kenwoods were a 130, 430, and 450 HF rigs. Most sold.

Art KB0UWR bought a Kenwood 231 2M that came with a cigarette lighter plug on it. Matched perfectly with the MFJ 25A switching P/S he won. We put 10 repeaters and 10 simplex freqs in the memories including the 147.06R+ rptr in Bellevue with the 131 PL tone. (The MFJ was the first door prize given out at 9:30.)

Scott W9AFB (at the base in Bellevue) picked up some connectors and also some of the hundreds of feet of FREE coax Rick KE4YQD gave away.

We advertised Doyle the battery guy and went to some trouble to haul his trailer out to the site, but only four (4) people took advantage. The used 88Ah type was forty (\$40) bucks. Much heavier than a car battery and made for UPS service, you can get \$18 from a recycler at 27c a pound

First Big Storm 04/14

In Nebraska, when we say T. O. it doesn't mean Terrell Owens, instead Tom Osborne, former Head Coach, Nebraska Congressman (R-NE) and current A/D for the college in Lincoln. It was his voice on the stadium public address telling the 50 to 60,000 fans who showed up for the spring game that they were canceling it for safety. Possible tornado(e) and lightning storm.

Pat K0CTU ran a public service (MS-walk) net that Saturday morning on .82, and Rich ZQG the Saturday Noon Swap Net, both completed with little other than comments about the weather.

Later in the day, Mary N0TRK ran a storm net on the .94 repeater, and Dale WB0OTE plus Mike W0MDL, both using the KC0OAU callsign, ran a weather net on 145.235. Paul WB0GXD used the K0POT (Pott. Co.) callsign on .82. -de Scanner

10AM Band Opening

It was a dark and stormy night, and then around 10AM Sunday we heard a lot of odd callsigns on .82, or if you had a tall antenna outside, other repeaters on the frequency with '5' area callsigns.

SWIARC members Bill KD0FJR and Scott W9AFB from Bellevue NE were on their radios. One of the out-of-towners was WC0X from Medicine Lodge KS (SW of Wichita over 300 mi from here), and even more surprising, he was on an .88 repeater. We don't know where the signals crossed.

The band was really up, several .82 repeaters audible at once on the frequency. Scott AFB went to the APRS propagation site.

The APRS site usually shows orange ovals but this morning it was all red and looked like the Michelin Man standing inside four truck tires. (Multiple wide ovals up and down the center of the country.)

We left .82 for .52 but between local comments and rapidly changing conditions I didn't hear any distant contacts. The band was up and down for the remainder of the morning. Anyone try .58?
