This time we didn't even have **Minutes** although ZQG summarized them off his computer screen for us. The Treasurer reported \$5,250, down a couple hundred due to purchasing 45c stamps.

The newsletter was late again, but promised for early next week. Supposed to be a pretty good one full of local content. Captioned pictures etc. Feature article on an AC Watt Meter is our show and tell for tonight.

Repeater

The .82 repeater hasn't been working well and Greg KG0S said he tried a couple of things like extending the hang time, finally setting it to a reduced power level, 10 rather than 50W, to make it work. Possibly a power supply problem. The Yaesu 7000 has a reputation for P/S failures. New 7000s cost around \$1200 plus programming cable, while a Kenwood repeater (25W output) runs \$1175. ICOMs like they have on Omaha's 146.94 are much more expensive. One rejected solution was to limit nets on our machine, which tend to run long, up to an hour, to fifteen minutes. (That was a joke.) The vote was unanimous to spend \$1302 for a new Yaesu. (Greg said it'd simplify cabling to our system.)

When we get the new machine, Greg may put an extra external fan on it. He said other boxes with that kind of power out have larger heat sinks. Besides time at home addressing the problem remotely, Greg made three (3) twenty five mile trips to the site. 50 miles round trip. Someone said 50c/mile is normal compensation but another voice said the IRS allows 55c a mile. We authourized \$82.50 reimbursement for mileage by unanimous vote.

One of our long standing ideas for the repeater is covering more of Pottawattamie County, the largest

of Iowa's 99. Greg KG0S said there's an unused antenna and coax on a 300 ft tower East of Carson IA, and we might see if there's a 2M pair available and put the repaired Yaesu out there. Regarding the fix for the old Yaesu box, a motion to authourize \$275 for it failed. (We'd heard Yaesu has a \$250 flat rate fix.) Another motion for KG0S to use discretion in having it fixed, no fixed amount mentioned, passed.

March Flea Market

The ARRL has been notified and will add our 1st Saturday in March Hamfest to their online list. In a bit of out of order business, we authourized up to a \$1000 budget for expenses, just like last year. (Should have done that before telling the ARRL.) Norm, Art UWR with an atomic wristwatch, Greg N0GR, and ZQG all agreed it was close to 7:30 as we opened the meeting. VP Norm announced he was canceling the December dinner meeting, but that was changed later.

At Norm's direction the Secretary reported a couple of contacts over the month including Brandon KC0USM in Missouri Valley, new to the area from Gering, Nebraska and quite active. Our Treasurer reported \$3,634, soon to be \$3,729 with dues collected at the meeting. (That's down a bunch due to purchase of a new repeater (\$1300) and prepaid expense (up to \$200) of a new Internet site.

Repeater

The old Yaesu 7000 repeater has been working well at a reduced power level of 10W with few complaints except West Omaha locations where it has often been difficult copy anyway. Greg KG0S has programmed the new one for 82/22, but not yet used it himself as a base station because he doesn't have a mike with a RJ-45 plug on the cable. Regarding future use of the old machine when it gets repaired, Greg has been given access to the Sheriff's antennas and feed line on towers across the county including one out by Carson IA, 20 mi East. (Did they go to 800?)

Norm JYD brought up the idea of a new net on our 82 repeater to discuss station construction issues. KG0S and Robert MUX suggested more time devoted to Amateur issues at the club meeting and less to quote, "business."

Newsletter

The October newsletter was printed by Office Max for \$34. Adding a box of envelopes it cost just short

of \$50. We agreed to pay ZQG when he produces the receipt. A motion to approve up to \$100 for a future issue failed. (We usually get it printed for Free by our Editor.)

SWIARC Site

Mike HZF said he hasn't heard from friend James lately, and doesn't know if he's made progress on setting up a site for us. Member Ryan TKZ said he could do something (he's offered before). Late Note: Ryan TKZ has an initial effort of a page devoted to SWIARC on his personal site including pictures and links to other popular Amateur sites like QRZ, eHam, and ARL.

December Dinner Meeting

Eight people would go to Golden Corral for dinner and only seven to the Chinese place. Mike HZF looked up the Corral on his phone; called them, and got the news it's \$10.99 plus drink (get water) at the Corral. We're looking at Thursday 27 December at 6:30PM. (Last year the Chinese place made us a deal at \$8 with the drink included. Iced tea or water.)

Art UWR asked about the optional gift exchange. Norm JYD said the 'gift' ought to have a value no more than \$10 and max weight of 25 lbs (in case it's coming from your junkbox).

George NME said he has two (2) of those Chinese made TV antennas with pre-amp and rotor as shown at the meeting a couple of months ago, and that one survived a strong wind upright, but no longer rotates. (The \$18 price has escalated to the mid or upper 20s.)

Scan 462.5625

Novice radio enthusiasts, the kind who don't yet have a license, sometimes start out with one of those little FRS radios you buy at Walmart. They don't have much simplex range, but do have a lot of options including identifying tones and a bunch of channels, 22 or so. However, being computerized much like our own radios, they often come up on channel one, 462.5625, and that is where a lot of people use them. Thus, put that freq in your scanner and attempt to make contact with them to show them how to get into Amateur Radio.

Brilliant

The light behind the LCD display in my Radio Shack scanner went out so I looked around for one of those \$2 White LEDs that I bought a few years ago. Couldn't find them. I did find some red, green, and yellow LEDs, and nearby, a brand new 12V incandescent bulb just like the one that'd burned out, so what the heck, I put that in.

Didn't work. Checked the voltage source on the scanner mother board, and it was 5V not twelve. Back to the LED box to pick the larger yellow one and an appropriate resistor, 330 Ohms. I've done this before and sure enough, the display had one real bright spot right in the middle, and a faint glow over the rest of it. Now here's my brilliant idea, use a metal file to flatten and coarsen the rounded, lens like LED housing. I still have a bright spot in the center of the LCD display, but the scattered yellow light from the flat spot on the LED lens lights up the rest of the LCD. Not like the original bulb, but adequate.
