**Third:** We need to give a HUGE thank you to Midwest Communications, Dan and Don for going out to Georges' Place, and finding and repairing the issue so that now there is power to the gazebo for us to use for fans and lights.

There are lots of things that I would like to see our Club do. George had a wonderful idea for the trailer. It could be used as a tool for EmComm, Parks on the Air, Field Day, and for any situation where emergency communications are needed. Its not that big of a stretch. We don't have to have brand new radio gear in it, just good working gear with well-made antennas.

Speaking of Antennas, Im hoping that I can get enough people to commit to getting the Arrow Antenna package which includes all parts needed to complete 10 2 meter/70 centimeter antennas. All parts are precut and the antennas I believe are already checked for SWR. Cost is \$38.50 each if we get the package, or \$59.00 if you order just one.

The State Hamvention/hamfest is on the 19<sup>th</sup> of June in Lincoln and the Lancaster Event Center which is on 84<sup>th</sup> street. Easiest way to get there is by taking I-80 to Waverly exit, then proceed west on Cornhusker Hwy to 84<sup>th</sup> St. Turn left and take 84<sup>th</sup> to the Event Center.

# **TECH CORNER:**

This is a new column for the newsletter that will be recurring each and every month. I am hoping for members to submit articles so that they can write for this section of the newsletter. It should be fun and of course, a true learning experience for all of us. This month I am introducing the new Anytone UV-D878II handheld Digital/Analog radio. This radio is improved over the first iteration of it by adding 2 specific features. 1. It now features not only transmitting on APRS but receiving on it as well. 2. The amount of Digital Contacts it will hold in its internal memory has been increased dramatically from 200,000 memories to a whopping 500,000. Yes, that is half a million contacts.

The only thing you really need to know is that the 878II has its own software and firmware. The software and firmware for the first version will NOT work. You have to download the correct version for this radio.

Price of this radio as of today May 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021, is \$299.99 from Bridgecom Systems as well as from Ham Radio Outlet. Enjoy!!!!!
