Repeater Committee Report August 2024

The upgrades at the IWCC hut are essentially complete! The new floor has been installed, the grounding system has been upgraded, the old non-working window air conditioner has been removed, and the equipment cabinet is back in place.

A layer of $\frac{3}{4}$ inch CCX green pressure-treated plywood has been laid over the existing floor. That should last a while. When the old air conditioner was removed it was discovered that the 2×4 framing around it had rotted away, so that has been replaced. The hole where the air conditioner was has been plugged with some of the $\frac{3}{4}$ inch CCX green pressuretreated plywood on both the inside and outside of the wall. The outside has been painted with one coat with more to follow.

The new ground buss bar has been installed on the new plywood where the air conditioner used to be. The existing site ground has been installed onto the new buss bar, as has all of the Club's polyphaser antenna surge suppressors. All connections have been made after cleaning the copper and applying copper coat to prevent corrosion and enhance conductivity.

The existing steel cabinet has been re-installed, and the Polyphaser AC surge suppression as well as the cabinet itself have been grounded to the new ground buss bar.

Dear Doctor In:

The coax to my antenna goes directly from the antenna on a 15 ft pole, along the grass to my shack window where it goes through the wall to my radio? Should I be worried?

Dear Newbie:

I assume you're concerned about lightning which is an everpresent risk around here, and the answer is, Yes, probably, unless you're dozens of feet lower than everything else nearby.

Here's a list of some things that might be at least partially effective in saving your equipment:

You can ground the shield of your coax at the bottom of your pole or tower. (This is done by inserting a double female connector with 2 PL connectors plugged into it, and grounding the panel the double female is mounted on. You can also buy a 'grounding kit' for the coax.)

From the 2nd PL connector headed toward the shack, you go a few feet and then wrap the coax in a couple of turns (like, 5 to 10 in diameter) which inserts an impedance to lightning still on the shield headed to your station. The coil should be sequential (or wide spaced), not all wound together. We're looking for inductance with very little capacitance.

You can ground the coax again just outside the shack. Make your own 'grounding kit' out of two 10 ft pieces of copper pipe (1 ft apart at the top) shoved 9 ft in the ground with a flattened piece of pipe bolted to the tops of the 2 pipes. The double female connector (see previous) goes through a half inch hole drilled in the flattened pipe.

Your homemade grounding kit is a good place to put a PolyPhaser. Oh wait, you've already spent fifty bucks on the copper pipes and the family budget isn't up to another hundred for the PolyPhaser? OK, you can leave that out. For you old timers, remember when a half inch copper pipe cost, like, 5 or 6 bucks? There's a political comment hidden there.

With the coax now in the shack, you have the ultimate lightning defense, disconnecting it from the radio any time you're not there. Put the free end of the coax some distance from everything else. Three feet at least.

So that's what most people do. Ever thought of eliminating the lightning before it hits? It's caused by a charge buildup between clouds subject to wind, and the ground. A little like rubbing your shoes on the carpet. Here's an idea: Put up another pole nearly the same height as your antenna; ground it, and install an upside down 'witch's broom' of a piece of conduit with 12 to 20 wires clamped to it, all cut diagonally so the sharp ends point to the sky. The idea is that high voltages like to congregate at a sharp point, and that electrons, attracted by a positively charged passing cloud, may jump off into the air thus reducing the charge remaining on the ground. Each point may, under such conditions, leak off about 125 mA. If the charged cloud doesn't move too guickly overhead, those points could reduce voltage buildup so that lightning never happens, at least in your neighborhood.

If this works you may not have to buy the hundred dollar PolyPhaser.

It was 3 hours of magic

Spectacular auroras thrill stargazers across the world (and internet) as intense geomagnetic storm batters Earth (photos)

A geomagnetic storm supercharged Earth's auroras, or the <u>northern</u> <u>lights</u> overnight on Thursday (Oct. 10), with aurora watchers in the U.S. and across the globe on hand to capture the stunning light-show. Not to be left out, Space.com's own crack team of aurora hunters (the A-Team?) were also out in the field to catch some incredible images.

According to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Space Weather Prediction Center (SWPC), the geomagnetic storm resulted from Earth <u>being</u> <u>struck by an eruption of charged particles</u> or "plasma" that burst from the sun, more specifically sunspot AR 3848 in the evening of Tuesday (Oct. 8).

The plasma eruption from the <u>solar flare</u>, an example of a "<u>coronal mass ejection</u>" or "CME," traveled to Earth at speeds of 2.9 million mph (4.6 million kph). That's about 2,000 times as fast as the top speed of a Lockheed Martin F-16 jet fighter. Yet, even at these incredible speeds, the CME still took a few days to travel the 93 million miles (150 million km) between <u>Earth</u> and the <u>sun.</u>

When the CME struck <u>Earth's magnetosphere</u>, the resultant geomagnetic storm reached G4 levels on the <u>SWPC's geomagnetic storm scale</u>. This is the second highest grade on the scale, which considers both severity and potential impacts. NOAA stated on Thursday evening that the storms have the potential to reach extreme <u>G5 levels</u>.
